SC 2023-0884 - Appendix A Code for Resolving Professionalism Referrals 3.7 Reporting

- a) Each LPP must file a written report with the chief judge of its circuit, the Florida Supreme Court, and The Florida Bar identifying all professionalism referrals received against a member of The Florida Bar in June and December of each calendar year.
- b) The biannual reports must include the following information for each referral for the six (6) calendar months preceding the month in which the report is due:
 - 1. The date of the referral;
 - 2. The circuit in which the issue arose;
 - 3. A short summary detailing the substance of the referral;
 - 4. The relationship of the respondent voluntarily participated in the process;
 - 5. Whether or not the respondent voluntarily participated in the process;
 - 6. The resolution, if any, of the referral; and
 - 7. Whether there were previous referrals against the respondent.
- c) The reports must not include identifying information for the respondent or the party who submitted the referral.

3. What are believed to be the causes of professionalism issues within your Circuit?

Historically, a large amount of complaints stem from criminal matters where the attorneys have less experience and appeared to have little mentoring prior to the complaint. For the complaints involving civ matters, the attorneys are generally sole practitioners or with small offices. We've found that encouragin mentoring has been helpful. For this reporting period, we had one complaint involving a settlement issue/debate with a seven year lawyer.

The Chair meets with new panel members as they rotate on (from our 3 tiered terms), and a group meeting is scheduled yearly.				

5. Please describe any training provided to committee members.

Each complaint case is assigned to a sub-panel of three members chaired by a member selected by the Chair, Lauren Heatwole. The cases are discussed when necessary. Templates/forms for the documents/letters are provided to the sub-chair with an explanation/reminder of the process. The members are reminded of the principals from Chief Judge Munyon's and Florida Supreme Court administrative orders at the regular meetings. The sub-panel discusses the proposed resolutions with the Chair.

The panel members have also been provided the information for the required Local Professionalism Panel Training program.

The Chair is also available at any time to meet/discuss with the members regarding their role and responsibilities.

6. How is your Circuit's Local Professionalism Panel promoted?

The Ninth Circuit Professionalism Panel has a link on the Ninth Judicial Circuit website, including information and links to the complaint forms. In addition, the Orange County Bar Association's Professionalism Committee helps to promote the Panel at local CLE's on professionalism. The local bar association professionalism committee also has appointed members on the Panel at the different terms/rotations. Information about the Professionalism Panel is also provided at local bar meetings and through word of mouth. Chief Judge Munyon is also actively involved and advises the Judges of the availability and usefulness of the Professionalism Panel.
