JUDGE LATIMORE: Hi, I'm Judge Alicia Latimore.

JUDGE WISH: I'm Judge Carly Wish.

JUDGE LATIMORE: And you're listening to 9th Unplugged.

JUDGE LATIMORE: Welcome, Judge Wish. We're glad to have you here at Unplugged.

JUDGE WISH: Thank you so much.

JUDGE LATIMORE: You're very welcome. Would you share with our audience the division you're assigned to and the responsibilities you have?

JUDGE WISH: Sure, I'm Division 82. It's a criminal county court division so we deal with misdemeanor offenses that includes traffic as well as ordinances, also traffic infractions. So nothing too serious but can be serious in some cases.

JUDGE LATIMORE: How long have you been on the bench?

JUDGE WISH: Since January of 2019 so –

JUDGE LATIMORE: We don't do math in the podcast --

JUDGE WISH: Sure, I love yoga so I spend a lot of time at the yoga studio and that's time to unwind, get out of the house. I do yoga at home but it's nice to get out of the house and into the studio where there's no distractions, no, you know, no dogs barking, no nothing like that. I love to spend time with my dogs.

JUDGE LATIMORE: You were born and raised in Boston?

the winter. But pretty much everything, yeah.

JUDGE LATIMORE: Now, are you a sports fan?

JUDGE WISH: Boston teams.

JUDGE LATIMORE: Okay.

JUDGE WISH: So hockey is number one, baseball number two, football, then basketball.

we'll travel back there together and do our thing, or the World Series, we went a couple of years

ago up there. So we tend to travel for sports.

JUDGE LATIMORE: Nice.

JUDGE WISH: Yeah.

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JUDGE LATIMORE: Any Florida teams' kind of catch your eye since you've been here?

JUDGE LATIMORE: That's fair.

certain topics which is understandable. You were one of the first people and that caught my eye

because I knew that you had lots of courage. Where do you get your courage from?

JUDGE WISH: Well, I've been through a lot in my life. And my dad says it's grit and he

always says that to me. I've had a lot of uphill battles with different types of illnesses throughout

my life. You know when I was in college, I almost went blind and so that was really an uphill

battle, from there diagnosed with MS you know and had to overcome a lot of obstacles with that

and have to deal with those things every day. So I think because you just have to get up every

day and go to work, whether you're feeling good or whether you're not feeling good. It's just

sort of – you have to do it and you have to know your limitations as well and acknowledge those

things and sometimes ask for help. So I think you know you can be strong but you have to know

that you have to have a good support system around and I think that that gives you courage.

JUDGE LATIMORE: What makes you laugh and smile the most?

JUDGE WISH: Um – I –

JUDGE LATIMORE: I know your husband. I know the husband –

JUDGE WISH: Yeah, yeah, I mean, I have a good set of friends and you know those are

the people you can be most honest with and joke about. My family, you know I didn't grow up

with any brothers or sisters so I don't really have that to lean on but I do have cousins that I'm

very close with. I love – I'm a big T.V. person and movie person so –

JUDGE LATIMORE: Are you?

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JUDGE WISH: Yeah, and I think that is like – sometimes it's just like bubble gum for the brain after the days that we have at work. You want to go home and watch like Below Deck or you know something silly and that's not real serious.
