AMENDED ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER MODIFYING COUNTY COURT CIVIL SUBDIVISION 75-6 CASELOAD, ORANGE COUNTY

The Circuit and County Courts are organized into divisions for more efficient case and records management and caseloads in each division are identified by numbered subdivisions to facilitate the exchange of caseloads when changes of division assignment occur. For the sake of judicial economy and to prevent confusion, occasionally subdivisions may need to be deactivated, new subdivisions created, and existing subdivisions caseloads modified.

By the power vested in the chief judge under Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, section 43.26, Florida Statutes, and rule 2.215 of the Florida Rules of General Practice and Judicial Administration, **effective immediately**, unless otherwise provided herein, to continue until further order and superseding any provisions in prior Administrative Orders which may be inconsistent, it is **ORDERED**:

- 1. The following procedures shall be followed in order to modify the caseload for Subdivision 75-6 created by a judicial vacancy.
- 2. The Clerk of Court shall transfer the open/pending cases in Subdivision 75-6 evenly among Subdivisions 70-6, 71-6, 72-6, 73-6, 74-6, 76-6, and 78-6 and shall furnish the judge in each current subdivision a list of those cases re-assigned. The judge in each subdivision shall furnish to the Clerk a list of those cases that the judge has determined should not be transferred. The cases transferred shall be flagged so that upon appointment of a judge to fill the vacancy, the cases shall be assigned back to Subdivision 75-6.
- 3. Any closed cases currently assigned to Subdivision 75-6 shall be reassigned to 75-6 TBD (per the Clerk of Court's nomenclature). Any reopened case will be randomly assigned among Subdivisions 70-6, 71-6, 72-6, 73-6, 74-6, 76-6, and 78-6 in the same manner of assigning new cases.
- 4. All hearings scheduled to be heard between now and August 25, 2023 shall be covered by other judges assigned to Orange County. Hearings set to be heard on or after August 25, 2023 will be heard by the newly assigned subdivision.

5. Administrative Order 2021-21-03 is vacated and set aside except to the extent that it has been incorporated and/or amended herein. Vacating an Administrative Order that vacates a prior Order does not revive the prior Order.
