ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER CREATING CIRCUIT COURT SUBDIVISION 09-5 AND ESTABLISHING A CASELOAD, ORANGE COUNTY

The Circuit and County Courts in Orange County are organized into divisions for more efficient case and records management. Caseloads in each division are identified by numbered subdivisions to facilitate the exchange of caseloads when changes of division assignment occur. After a careful review of case filings and caseloads and for the sake of judicial economy and to prevent confusion, occasionally subdivisions may need to be de-activated, new subdivisions created, and existing subdivisions caseloads modified.

By the power vested in the chief judge under Article V, section 2(d) of the Florida Constitution, section 43.26, Florida Statutes, and Rule 2.215 of the Florida Rules of General Practice and Judicial Administration, effective **immediately**, unless otherwise provided herein, to continue until further order and superseding any provisions in prior Administrative Orders that may be inconsistent, it is **ORDERED**:

Subdivision 09-5 is hereby created, to begin **January 3, 2023**, unless otherwise provided herein. The following procedures shall be followed in order to accumulate a caseload for Subdivision 09-5 and to have the subdivision ready for disposition of cases to begin on **January 3, 2023**:

- 1. The Clerk shall divide the existing probate, mental health and guardianship case types among Subdivisions 01-5, 02-5, and 09-5 equally and randomly to include closed cases.
- 2. All newly filed cases shall be assigned sequentially by case type on a rotating basis between Subdivisions 01-5, 02-5, and 09-5.
- 3. Upon appointment of counsel, Marchman Act case types shall be re-assigned to Subdivision 23-1 for additional commitment.
